THE RATIONALE

In the dawn of the 2nd century of psychoanalysis, we notice the presence not only of a wealth of models but also a diverse range of theoretical shifts: from drive gratification to the search for the object and, thereafter, from the dyad drive and object to the interplay of the two subjects.

Some psychoanalysts, though, further distance themselves theoretically from the narcissistic and the object relations approach and introduce the relational dimension.

This approach emphasizes not only the search of the true self in the intrapsychic realm, but also the genuine quest of the other in the interpersonal sphere, beyond projective and identificatory mechanisms.

Even so, the analysis of the phenomena of the intrapsychic space (psychic conflicts, pathological object relations, transference, etc) seems to continue to be the main drift of contemporary psychoanalytic approach.

Within this context, next to Freudian epistemological propositions, “complementary” models of various clinical approaches have been advocated. For instance, the epistemological model of intersubjectivity aims at the broadening of the –theoretical– perspective, by highlighting the interrelation between subject and object. Quite often though, both aspects are examined concurrently: unconscious and conscious, transference and countertransference, the relation of the subject with the social world.

Meanwhile, contemporary neuro-physiological advancement in cerebral plasticity and memory systems, as well as research findings from studies from developmental psychology and infant observation provided new information that stressed the importance of the emotional bond between the subject and the significant Other (the “objective object”) in the here and now of each stage of child development.

These developments had a profound influence on the psychoanalytic views of transference and counter-transference, the analytic field, the psychoanalytic process and technique, the psychic change, and last but not least on clinical theories of trauma, emotion and psychic reality.



The concept of the subject in psychoanalysis belongs both to the intrapsychic and the interpersonal realms. In the realm of the intrapsychic unconscious, it is differentiated from the ego and the superego; in the realm of the interpersonal, it develops in relation to the significant other. It is worth mentioning that the unconscious desire for the Other and the Other's desire for the subject is expressed not only verbally but also non-verbally, and some times is imprinted on the body itself.

Within this context then the search for truth and the development of an authentic relationship between analyst and analysand will be complemented by the re-ordering of the internalised pathological object relations and the "alienated" ego. In this way, the emergence of the subject will be facilitated and it will thus be released from the "shadow of the object".

"The [subjective] object is always being destroyed [in unconscious fantasy]. This destruction becomes the unconscious backcloth for love of a real object. [Then]...the subject is able to use the object." (Winnicott, 1971)
